
On **Friday 14 December** we will be having a **morning tea** to officially **thank** our hard working volunteers. Our school runs so smoothly with the support of our community and we owe thanks to all of you for coordinating, organising and supporting in the classroom, the school yard and the many exciting events that we run for our community! Please join us in the staff room at **9am** next Friday morning.

To continue our focus on **Teaching and Learning** in 2019, we appointed two **Primary Maths Specialist** teachers. Congratulations to **Ivana** and **Aydan** who were the successful candidates. Next year part of their role will be working with teachers across the school to coach and model in Numeracy and further support our staff and students.

We have developed our **indicative budget** for 2019 and this was endorsed at our school council meeting on Tuesday night. There are some key commitments we are making for 2019 with further resources allocated for teaching and learning and some significant resources put aside to improve the school building and grounds.

- ◆ \$4,000 budget for books and resources for the our new library
- ◆ Reintroduction of the tax deductible Library Fund
- ◆ \$20,000 allocation to Buildings and Grounds subcommittee
- ◆ \$10,000 for refurbishment works to student toilets

We have made some very pleasing improvements this year in our **student absence data**. The implementation of the SMS system has helped reduce unexplained absences, but as you can see from the graph below we still have a large amount to follow up before the end of the year. We will focus further on absences next year and continue to communicate the message that **every day counts** when it comes to school attendance. We will shortly send home a note highlighting any unexplained absences your child has outstanding. These should be returned to school ASAP.



Don't forget, **TeamKids** will be taking over our Out of School Hours Care program from Monday 7 January with a Holiday Program. You can book spots for the holiday program or the regular before and after care through their website. TeamKids will also be running a School Community Meet and Greet session with a free coffee van set up on Friday 14 December (7.00am-9.00am).

# FOUNDATION

Over the last few weeks, **Foundation** students have been learning about **money**.

We've described the features of money (did you know that notes go up in size according to their value?), ordered coins and notes by their value, skip counted small collections of coins and some of us even began to calculate change!

Here are some things you can do at home to support and extend this learning:

- ♦ **Paying for items:** Ask your child to help you pay for items, they may hand you the necessary money or count it for the cashier!
- ♦ **Shopping lists:** Ask your children to help you compile a shopping list of items needed at home and find out the costs of each item
- ♦ **Research purchases:** Work with your children to research online or shop around to find the best price for an item
- ♦ **Set goals:** If your child earns pocket money, help them set a savings goal and track their progress with a visual chart
- ♦ **Needs VS wants:** Discuss the difference between needs and wants and encourage your children to think about this before spending or before asking you to buy something!




In 1/2 this term we have been learning about different types of **poetry**.


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## 2019 PIANO MUSIC PROGRAM AT BSPS


