

Parent Opinion

This term we are busy collecting data from students and staff about their attitudes and opinions of our school. Our Years 4-6 students have recently completed the 'Students Attitudes to School Survey' and our staff have recently undertaken the annual 'Staff Opinion Survey'.

Shortly, all families will also be invited to complete the 'Parent Opinion Survey'. The information from this feedback helps us gauge our progress toward the goals and targets in our School Strategic Plan and identify different areas of focus for us as a school. As an example, some of the work with the introduction of our 'Health and Wellbeing' specialist subject came about from the responses from the student survey in 2021 and 2022! We are also planning some adjustments to our reporting process for next year in response to feedback we had from families in our Parent Opinion survey.

Amici Insieme

We recently announced the launch of our newest initiative at BSPS, Amici Insieme. This is a Peer Support program that will draw on the strength of our cross-aged groups that we usually only implement on Italian Day. In Week 7, we will timetable these sessions once per week and our Years 5 & 6 students will take on a direct leadership role in the planning, facilitating and running the

sessions, with the support of our teachers.

This week Caro, Giada, Chiara, Anna and Aydan spent two days training the 5/6 students as leaders of the program. During the cross age sessions, our students will lead the sessions and deliver aspects of the Social and Emotional Learning curriculum. They will be supported by teachers and school staff and have the opportunity to build their confidence and understanding, while strengthening peer connections across the school.

I can't wait to see how the implementation of this approach goes and how we can successfully evolve it into another positive learning experience for our students.

Student Led Conferences

Our gratitude goes out to everyone for the work that went to prepare for our Student Led Conferences last week! There is always such a buzz from students, families and staff after the event.

I don't take it for granted that our students are 'active learners' at BSPS right from day one. That our students can talk about their learning, their strengths and opportunities for further growth is such a testimony to the hard work of all of us and each year they are able to do so with more confidence, certainty and clarity.

What am I up to?

In my role, I have the privileged position to lead our school and support our community. I also get the opportunity to contribute to the strength of our education system by working with other schools and the Department of Education.

Throughout August, I have a couple of opportunities to do this. I am supporting two schools (Goonawarra Primary School and Victorian School of Languages - VSL) with their school review as a challenge partner. I am also a member of the Bilingual Principals' Network Executive and work with this team to support the leadership of other bilingual schools.

My experience in schools has always highlighted to me that it is so easy to get caught up in what happens inside our own school – sometimes leading to insular thinking. The opportunity to build strong networks, to learn from and with other schools and the chance to open our eyes to new and fresh perspectives can only benefit all students who are part of our public education system.

Our school is in the fortunate place to have a strong leadership team and established processes and systems. It means I can undertake this work with minimal disruption to the school and provide the opportunity for our leadership team to step up in my absence. I'll keep you posted with my learnings!

We have had a lot of questions about how students are selected for the Victorian Challenge and Enrichment Program (sometimes referred to as the High Ability Program or Student Excellence Program).

The Victorian Challenge and Enrichment Program is a funded enrichment program run by the Department of Education. The series offers a range of different activities that are designed to extend and enrich students in their areas of strength. Students selected to participate in the program are usually at least one year ahead in the curriculum, demonstrated in the assessments they complete, NAPLAN results or Victorian Curriculum level shown on reports. Students can also be selected in a less formal way, for instance by the verbal or demonstrated contributions they make during class.

When we have any extra places in a particular event or activity, we may allocate them to students who have demonstrated a keen interest in the subject area. Unfortunately, we are not able to give a spot to every child who has an interest in that area, so sometimes students will miss out.

Most of the opportunities available in the program are more suited to Year 5/6 students, so we are not able to offer as many opportunities to our Year 3/4 high ability students. We have recently introduced an internal writing program for some of our writers in Year 3/4 and are looking at opportunities for Year 3/4 students in mathematics.

Our classroom teachers always plan for a range of abilities in their classroom and include extension as part of the lesson planning process. Our aim is to ensure every child at BSPS receives the appropriate level of challenge in their learning at school.



HEALTH AND WELLBEING






VEARS 3/4

STEM


This term, the Year 5/6 students are taking part in a range of experiments designed to develop a greater understanding of the composition of different foods and how foods are manipulated to create particular effects.

Last week, they explored the super sustainable and nutritious superfood, Kelp. They learned about the benefits of kelp farms (as opposed to conventional farms) and made a Japanese style Seaweed salad. This week they are commencing the much anticipated, 'Chocolate Competition'. They have started developing a brand for a block of chocolate and will delve into a bit of chocolate making in the coming weeks.





This term, the Grade 3/4 students are investigating different forces, with a focus on non-contact forces such as magnetic force, and contact forces such as pushing and pulling. The students have made a gravity defying magnetic sculpture and designed rockets that are thrust into the air by gases (created by a dissolving tablet) that push their way out of a film canister (pushing the rest of the rocket in the other direction) .
