During National Day of Action Against Bullying we looked at connections we have in our lives and the importance of these. Check out these incredible trees of connection we made!



We have also been learning about the importance of physical activity. We learned that there are obvious physical benefits to being active, but increasing movement or activity also decreases symptoms of depression, anxiety, and loneliness and improves mental focus and clarity!

This week we focussed on types of friends. We explored what encourages us to form friendships with different people (common interests, admirable qualities etc). Through various activities we identified that our friends can fall into the categories of 'best friends', 'friends' and 'people we know'. We also discussed the fact that friendships can change over time for various reasons.

This week would be a great time to discuss with your child the different friends they have in their lives and how friendships may change. Some friends may be more important at different times in their lives.

Next week we will be focusing on the importance of support networks and the role that friends play in each other's lives. We will be constructing a visual representation of this during the session.

It would be helpful to encourage your child to identify friends they have who can provide support to them if the need arises.













It's been a packed Term for PE and school sports. We have covered athletics at the start of the term, spent a couple of weeks on AFL, and are now in the middle of our gymnastics in-school program. The gymnastics program has been a huge hit with students exploring movements and skills they haven't before. They've been working on landing correctly, balancing, being strong in certain areas, improving their coordination, and having fun trying something new. It's been great to see all the students giving it an honest go and putting themselves into unfamiliar and uncomfortable situations.

We also just had our Divisional Athletics Event where we had 7 students represent the school in events like the 800m, discus, and high jump. Toby: "What does a maths lesson usually look like in 1/2?"

Selma: "We usually start with a game. Then we do a launch. The launch is where we go through the activity. Then we go through the explore where we explore the learning intention and basically what we are learning! After the task we come down to the floor and people share their ideas and then the teacher writes some of the strategies on the board."

Toby: "Can you tell me what you have been learning in maths lately?"

Elfrieda: "We've been learning to divide things equally even if there are remainders."

Selma: "We've been working on division and we're learning how to split numbers into equal groups whether they are even or odd numbers."

Toby: Can you explain one of your learning tasks to me?

Henrietta: We were making equal groups of 20. I made a few (solutions). Two groups of 10, ten groups of 2, five groups of 4 and four groups of 5. And I did another number afterwards (100) as a challenge for me and I showed them in arrays.

Selma: We read a book (about division). In this one I have some bicycles, so I've got my groups and my division problem, and I've shown different ways you can make 60 and equal groups. Here is where I have done part-part whole. Here I have 60 divided by 3 is 20, and 30 times 2 is 60.

Elfrieda: We wanted to know how many buckets we can split 20 apples into. I found out three ways. First, I drew one circle and then I drew another one and kept on counting until I got up to 20 and then the answer was 1,2,3,4,5 baskets. And I also did part, part, part, part, part whole, I split it into five parts. I also did an array because it makes it easier for other people to see (the solution).

Did you know that August is poetry month?

In Year 3/4, in Writing, we have been focusing on writing poetry using different poetic devices. Alliteration is always acceptable as a way to actually engage the audience!

We have also been exploring similes, metaphors and hyperbole and applying these to our poems about nature, climate change and deep sensory experiences we have had! Students have been encouraged to submit poems to the Poem Forest 2023, in which for every poem application one tree is planted. This is a great way to combine creativity with environmental proactivity! Since 2021, 10,700 poem trees have been planted. Interested in seeing our work?
