

#### **NAPLAN**

NAPLAN testing for Writing, Reading, Language Conventions and Mathematics will commence on 12 March for our Year 3 and Year 5 students. For our students, NAPLAN simply gives a snapshot of how they perform on the day. As a school, we examine the results to give us an indication of the strengths of our teaching and learning program, highlight areas for us to focus and also help us evaluate the effectiveness of teaching in a bilingual model. We expect our students to approach these tests just as they would any other task at school and try their personal best. Students are not required to study, prepare or do anything in the lead up to these tests. Year 3 students may participate in some 'practice' tests at school to get them familiar with the testing genre. The best preparation is a good night's sleep and a healthy breakfast!

## VEARS 3/4

#### CERES Excursion - Anya

On Tuesday, the 3/4 community went on a really fun excursion to CERES! There were beautiful native plants that we could taste and smell, like saltbush, Warrigal greens and pigface. We also learnt the story of Tiddalik, a very greedy frog who drank too much water. We even got to reenact the story, playing all sorts of native animals! The excursion helped us with our Unit of Work on First Contact, and we figured out lots of things about how the Wurundjeri Woi Wurrung people lived and what they ate before Europeans arrived in Australia.







#### Reading - Minka

In Reading/Lettura, we have been practising reciprocal reading. Reciprocal reading is when you are in a group you read the same text together. Each member of the group has a role. The Predictor predicts what will happen in the text, the Summariser explains the main idea, the Questioner asks questions about the text and the Clarifier clears up any questions and finds the meaning of tricky words.





#### Writing - Ted

In Writing/Scrittura, we are learning to write texts of our choice, demonstrating our writing skills (le nostre capacità come autori). From my personal experience, everyone loves it! We've been writing all sorts of texts, from stories to persuasive letters and informative texts. We've been writing with wacky and weird prompts, for example: a rich frog with paparazzi taking photos. Writing has been a blast. I hope it's going to be even more enjoyable in the future.

Some of us even wrote letters to Toby to try and convince him to get a school cafeteria.





#### Maths - Sunday

In Maths, we are learning to use different strategies to solve problems. The strategies that we have been using are trial and error, working step by step, visualising, looking for a pattern, working backwards, and looking for similarities and differences. We've been using these strategies to explore place value. This is an example of place value: say we had the number 157. The 1 would go into the hundreds column, The 5 would go into the tens column, and the 7 in the ones column. What if the 7 was in the hundreds column? Then the1 in the tens column? And the 5 in the ones column? Then the number would be 715!



## VEARS 5/6

In **5/6** so far this year we have been learning about all kinds of things but we have narrowed it down to four subjects to share with you. Subject one: in Maths - in both Italian and English, we have been learning about place value and Sistema numerico decimale.

In Writing, we have been able to choose among different text types in English but in Italian we could only choose between testo narrativo or testo informative.

In Unit of Work we have been learning about democracy and famous leaders in history, including some of their speeches, to analyse how they used persuasive language.

And finally, in Reading we have been using different strategies to understand 'Le Avventure di Alice nel Paese delle Meraviglie'. Thank you for reading about our learning here in 5/6. B**y Harry and Nellie**

QKR has an update ready to go and are waiting notification that it has been added to the Google Store.




