E NOTIZIE DI TREVOR The long weekend gave us all the chance to pause for a mid-term break before we tick off the final few weeks of term. After the disruptions to learning last year, we have all experienced a much more consistent and predictable start to the year something we've not seen since 2019!

Attendance

The return to predictability, routine and a greater 'sense of normal' is the perfect time to reignite conversations about student attendance at school.

I've had this on my list for a while now, but had to make a conscious decision about when the right time was for us to resume this work. Last year our focus was on being back at school for a whole year, but we were still dealing with impacts of COVID, managing isolation requirements and recovering from the magnitude of what we'd all been through.

For many in our community, the opening of borders meant family holidays could resume and we recognised that these weren't a luxury - but a necessity after many being kept apart for so long.

Moving in to 2023, the time is right to reignite this shared priority! We know that regular attendance is one of the most important elements in a child's education. Missing school regularly can put kids behind academically by disrupting learning continuity and leading to gaps in understanding. It also negatively impacts on peer connections.

Our leadership team have been looking at ways we can continue to promote and encourage attendance, as well as celebrate improved attendance. We are looking at how we can flag attendance sooner rather than later, as we know attendance habits are built in the early years of schooling. At our Student Led Conferences in Week 9, you will receive a summary of your child's attendance so far this year. This will give you an indication of how your child is travelling early in the school year and help us all work together to set goals and targets for those who may need additional support.

Construction Works

It feels like our school has been under a flurry of construction this term – and the end isn't in sight just yet! Last week I was very excited to receive confirmation that the VSBA (Victorian Schools Building Authority) has approved the installation of a new front and side fence for our school.

Did you know that parts of our current fence date back to the mid-fifties? After 70-odd years of dutiful service, it's time to farewell our existing fence and welcome a new addition that is sure to significantly lift the curb appeal of

The works are due to start quicker than we anticipated with some temporary fencing already being installed in Rathdowne Street. The disruptions *should* be minimal and limited to times where certain entry and exit points are out of action. We are also pleased to let you know that our unique and beautiful front gate is being retained and incorporated into the new design.

The school holidays should see the finalisation of the staff toilet repairs, sandblasting and repainting of the fire escape, some external and internal repainting and the addition of some split system units upstairs in our main building.

We may almost feel like we are returning to a new school in Term 2!

Our students have started preparing for the Student Led Conferences on Tuesday 28 March. You can book your meeting time through Compass with one of your child's teachers. Please note that, on this day, students will be dismissed at 12.00pm and TeamKids will run an extended day for students who require supervision.

We are excited to welcome you into the learning areas for 2023 and for you to see how our students are active and engaged with their learning and how reflective they are on their progress.

We believe in standing up for the rights of others, and being an upstander. IWD raises awareness about discrimination and stereotypes.


The IAT are now working on a display to celebrate this message and will be putting it up in the main entrance soon, come take a look!


National Ride2School Day

Our first day of book shopping, we learnt about picking 'good fit books' which are interesting to us and are not too hard.










A Morning of Literacy learning from a student's perspective...

Well, in reading we are doing Reciprocal Reading Roles, we take it in turns reading - there is a Predictor, Clarifier, Questioner and Summariser. We take it in turns in all the roles. It's a bit like book club. I think it is quite fun, because you can focus on what your role is, and you have a role different to everyone else, so we focus more.


Does this change the way you read?

You think about what you are doing more (as you read), but then say it to your group and make a big discussion of it. Making mistakes can be a lot of fun, because the discussion helps you to patch up the hole in your understanding. It's better than other reading activities that we have done, although it does depend on your reading personality – whether you like reading to yourself or having the discussion.

We are reading Bindi, by Kirli Saunders. I would never have picked it up myself, but it is one of the things I like about reciprocal reading - you don't chose the book, it is chosen for you - it's a bit of challenge for us all.

Are you reading a different book in Italian?

We're reading Colore di Napoli. It's a bit trickier in Italian, because it's not our first language, but it is still as engaging - you understand more in English, but in Italian, the role of Clarifier is a harder job, because people have more questions. Having a Clarifier makes the book easier to understand.

This week, the students learnt that science is not just about conducting experiments, but also about studying the natural world around us. 
