IDAHOBIT Day

Dogs in School

We have received some feedback this term from some members in our community concerned about interactions with dogs on our school grounds. In order for everyone to feel safe and comfortable around our four-legged friends, our Dogs in School Policy outlines some clear guidelines for dog owners, so please take a moment to read.

Some specific points to take note of include:

- All dogs entering Brunswick South Primary School must be on short leads (not extendable leads) that are controlled by an adult, not by a child
- Dogs must not be near our class line up areas

- Dogs owners must enter via the Brunswick Road or Park Street gates
- Dogs should remain on the asphalt areas and not on the synthetic turf areas
- Dog owners are requested to always be mindful that children are the first priority in a school environment and that some children are unfamiliar and/or afraid of dogs
- Dog owners are requested to assess the demeanour of their dog before entering the school grounds and are requested not to enter the school grounds if the demeanour of the dog is not suited to an environment where children are present
- Dog owners must be familiar with their legal responsibilities

Thanks in advance for adhering to this policy – if everyone does their bit, we can continue to be a community that is inclusive of our four-legged family members!

In Italian Skills we have been learning about etymology. Etymology is the study of words, where they come from and how they have developed over time. A fun activity we have done is picking a technical word about natural disasters, for example I did "ciclone", (cyclone) and I recorded it in a table and found out the word comes from the Greek word 'kuklos' (circle).





In Writing we have been learning about explanation texts. An explanation text is a text that explains how something works or what something does. The structure starts with a general statement, then information, an explanation and finishes with a conclusion. Word types that are used are present tense verbs, subject-specific vocabulary, adjectives, adverbs, time connectives and cause and effect statements.

In Maths we have been learning about perimeter and area, perimeter is the distance around the edge of the shape. An area is the amount of space inside a shape. An activity we've done is where we make a 2D shape that looks like a letter but it has to have an area of 6cm squared and we could use half centimetres squared and one centimetres squared. There were difficult shapes like K and P but there were also easy shapes like C and I. We also did a warm up where we had a 2D shape and had to find three different strategies to find its perimeter.



In Units of Work we have been learning about meteorology. A task we did was finding information on the Bureau of Meteorology website about a city in Australia; some people chose Canberra, others chose Melbourne and then researched the cloud cover, the temperature, the precipitation and the wind speed. After that we made predictions about what the weather would be like in the future based on the information we gathered.

In Reading, we have been learning about explanation texts. I liked reading and working in a team to read and order a text about plants that grow. *Giselle*




In Writing, we have been writing narrative texts. It has been very fun to see some students' stories in this newsletter!






Now that was some good work for a 3/4 student! *Guinny*

ENVIRONMENT ACTION TEAM (E.A.T)

Brunswick South Primary School Biodiversity Audit

Brunswick South PS are part of the Resource Smart Schools program. We have been working hard to complete our RSS Core module. Late last year Eileen's class conducted a Biodiversity audit of the school. Biodiversity is all the different kinds of life you will find in one area—the variety of animals, plants, fungi, and even microorganisms like bacteria that make up our natural world. The students enjoyed documenting the plant and animal life on the school grounds. The audit data was then used by the students to identify areas for improvement and discuss ways to increase biodiversity at BSPS. Great work everyone!









The BSPS biodiversity score was 78. Together with Eileen and the CERES facilitator, the students created a Biodiversity Action Plan that will be used to improve the school grounds in the coming years. Here were some of the ideas the students came up with;

- Install some nesting boxes and Bee hotels
- Plant more indigenous plants to provide habitat for local wildlife
- Install a bird bath (off ground), to encourage native birds to visit the grounds
- Rejuvenate herb & vegie patches
- Protect sensitive vegetation w/ guards & more signs
